

**Site License Agreement**  
**University of Toronto Press Incorporated**

University of Toronto Press Incorporated (5201 Dufferin Street, North York, ON, M3H 5T8) as owner and publisher of *journal name here* (Licensed Material) hereby grants to

a nontransferable and nonexclusive license to access, receive, disseminate locally according to the procedures, terms, and conditions set forth in the Agreement; and with the signature below the Licensee accepts these terms.

**Warranty of Publisher to Offer Resource**

University of Toronto Press Incorporated warrants to the Licensee that it is fully authorized to license, in accordance with the terms and conditions hereof, the Licensed Material; and that the Licensed Material, if used as contemplated in this Agreement, does not, in any known way, infringe any copyright or other proprietary or intellectual property rights of any natural or legal person.

**Scope of License**

Access to the Licensed Material will be made available to all Internet Protocol (IP) addresses within the domain of the Licensee, as described in Schedule 1. All members of the Licensee's campus or institutional community who are authorized to use the computers within this domain are deemed Authorized Users of the site license. Walk-ins are also deemed Authorized Users of the site license, but do not have remote access privileges. For an organization with locations in more than one city, each location is considered to be a separate site and would require separate license agreements unless a blanket agreement can be negotiated with University of Toronto Press Incorporated.

**Access and Availability**

Licensees will have perpetual access to content for 2009 and subsequent years as long as this agreement is renewed. Unless specifically addressed by the License, the backfile content is not included in the access. See Schedule 1 for subscription period and subscription fee.

University of Toronto Press Incorporated, either directly or through a contractor, shall use all reasonable endeavors to make access available on a 24-hour basis. But if access is suspended or interrupted or a defect occurs that prevent access, University of Toronto Press Incorporated's liability shall be limited to using all reasonable efforts to restore access as soon as is reasonably practicable.

**Permitted Use and Prohibitions**

Authorized Users may download, save, and print articles for their own non-commercial education and research use, but may not further disseminate these articles in their electronic form without express written permission from University of Toronto Press Incorporated. It is strictly prohibited for the Licensee to download copies of the Licensed Material for archival use. The Licensee will exercise reasonable efforts to ensure that access to and use of the Licensed Material is limited to Authorized Users. Provisions for sharing by the Licensee of the Licensed Material with persons outside the Licensee's campus or institution, or with other institutions affiliated with the Licensee, may be negotiated between University of Toronto Press Incorporated and the Licensee and must be attached in writing to this Site License Agreement.

*Interlibrary Loan:* A hard copy, printed from the electronic files of the Licensed Material, may be supplied to another institution by mail or fax or secure transmission using Ariel or its equivalent (whereby the electronic article is deleted immediately after printing).

### **Breach of this Agreement**

Under ordinary circumstances, should a breach of this Agreement by the Licensee or an Authorized User come to the attention of University of Toronto Press Incorporated, University of Toronto Press Incorporated will inform the Licensee and provide a reasonable amount of time (ordinarily 30 days) for investigation and if necessary, correction of the breach. But University of Toronto Press Incorporated shall have the right immediately to suspend this License Agreement, without need for provision of proof, if it determines that the Licensee has committed a serious and material breach of the Agreement or one that is likely to continue. If it is feasible to cut off the access of a single offending user, rather than the entire institution, that will be done.

If University of Toronto Press Incorporated is in breach of this Agreement, the Licensee will inform University of Toronto Press Incorporated in writing and allow 30 days to mend the breach. If the breach is not cured, the Licensee may terminate the Agreement upon written notice and receive a pro-rated refund.

### **Changes to License**

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and supersedes all prior communications, understanding, and agreements, until such time as modifications or amendments to the Agreement are mutually agreed to in writing and signed by the authorized representatives of both parties.
